

Hop Scott Volunteer Driver Program

How did we come up with the concept of Hop Scott

- Discovery of needs in rural areas in 2018-2019 using "needs groups" in geographic areasengaging community leaders, non-profits, users of transportation resources
- Message was similar for rural areas- NO OPTIONS or FEW OPTIONS
- What kind of Service will fulfill need?
- Volunteer service after COVID has changed
- · Concept of wheelchair ramp minivans driven by volunteers
- Discovered Live Well at Home Grant funded 50/50 by MN Human Services
- Applied for grant for wheelchair ramp mini vans in rural areas driven by volunteer drivers in April/2020.
- Volunteer Van program/Hop Scott- (picture below)
- Volunteer driver recruitment vetted and trained by staff. 12 available in 2023
- · Scott County using Transportation Tax dollars to fund
- · Carver County looking at options to copy
- 3 County owned vans, insured and maintained by County
- Program began in January of 2022

Volunteer drivers often bring patients to medical appoints and this much more personal means of transportation is less stressful than a bus for those needing transportation help. In addition, food shelf deliveries throughout the County have increased significantly this past year with volunteer drivers delivering food to families and individuals that otherwise would not be able to get to a food shelf for assistance.


Hop Scott Updates for 2022-2023

606 Trips performed in 2022- This is FANTASTIC

807 Trips so far in 2023 through October

Anchor Center (mental Health Center in Scott County), Belle Plaine Food Shelf, Elko/New Market food, New Prague Food Shelf, Jordan Food Shelf distributions- biggest impacts

Last night we did 13 people. Yay! One year later our numbers are up! I had a client almost in tears when I told her that we would bring her food. She has no transportation, no money, and no food. Our senior living apartments have a steady stream of repeat customers, so we are needed and appreciated there. PLUS, we have the most wonderful delivery drivers. We are so grateful for Hop Scott and the opportunities we can offer our clients!"

- New Prague Food Shelf- <u>started</u>
- Arboretum Food distribution Shakopee began in July
- Jordan Food Shelf/Family Resource Center-started Aug


