


# Pulse checks on draft recommendations

- Based on discussion at the December 16 meeting, Chair Elkins will present 3 draft recommendations today for review and input.
- Using a zero-to-five scale, members are encouraged to share their level of agreement with the proposed language.
- This is not a formal vote. It's a pulse-check to gauge support and inform potential revisions.
- Where there is lack of consensus or support, members may briefly share what changes would shift their position towards support without losing the support of other members.

# Process for each draft recommendation

- Chair Elkins will walk through the language as proposed.
- Members may ask brief clarifying questions.
- MAD will ask members to share their rating: 0, 1, 2, 3, 4, 5
- In person members by show of raised hand, online members by posting the number in the chat.
- MAD will report the results.
- Chair Elkins will give members who rated 0, 1, or 2 to share a brief comment or proposed modification.
- Chair will take these comments into consideration for potential revisions to share before the January 21 meeting.




