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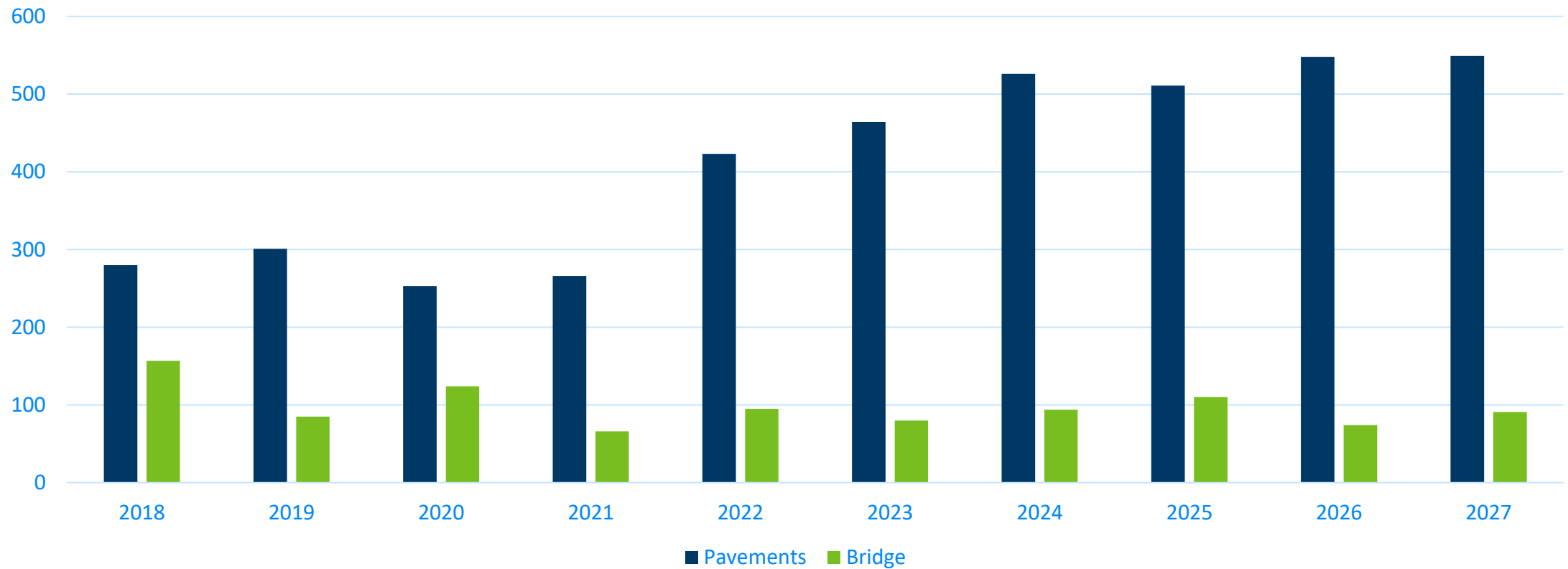

Capital Highway Investment Plan (CHIP)

- MnDOT's 10 year investment plan
- Ensures that MnDOT is meeting the investment levels and performance outcomes identified in MnDOT's 20-year State Highway Investment Plan
- Pavement, Bridge, Roadside Infrastructure, Mobility, Freight, Bicycle, Pedestrian, etc.
- All data based on current funding mechanisms

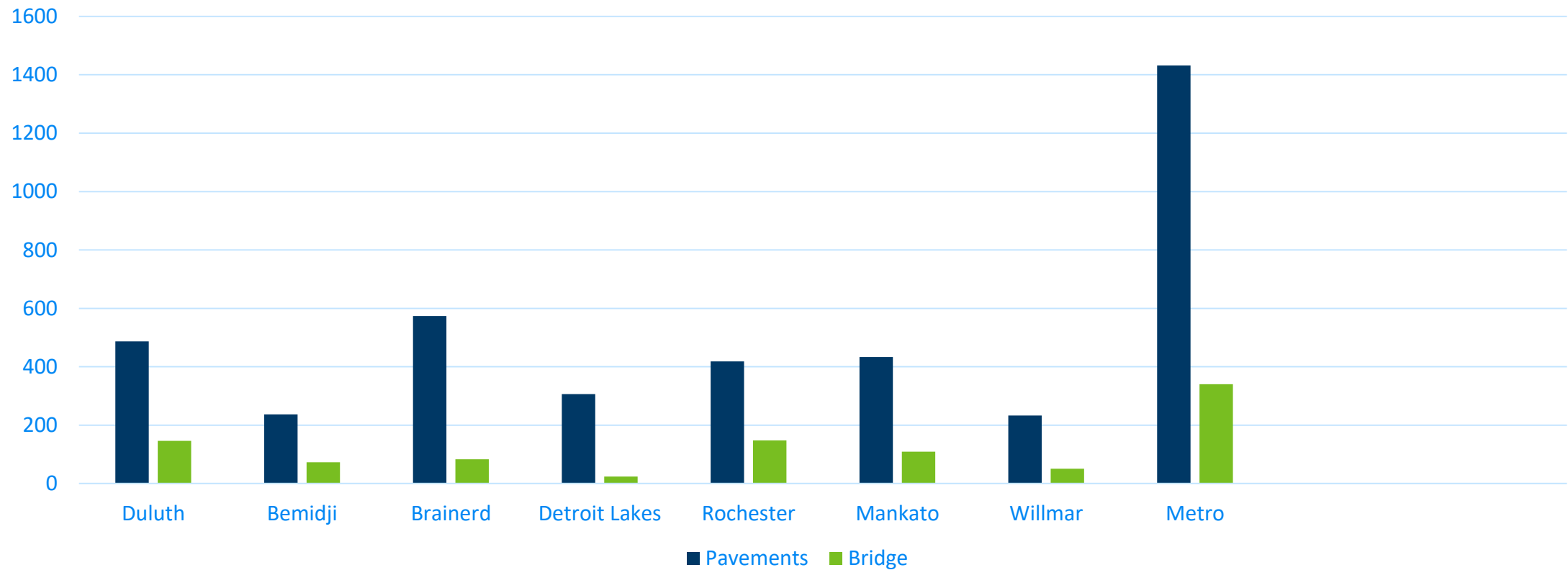
Statewide Trends

Points to Consider

- MnDOT's work is just a portion of the total, MAPA says their work is 1/3 MnDOT, 1/3 City and County and 1/3 private.
- MnDOT does a significant amount of recycling and will do more in the future. Currently about 20% of Hot-mixed-asphalt is recycled. In addition, most base materials, especially in the Metro are from recycled materials.
- MnDOT uses “high” quality aggregates that are not distributed equally across the state.
- New technologies will reduce the need for virgin aggregates
