## **Amy Hewitt – University of Minnesota**

Amy Hewitt from the University of Minnesota gave a presentation on the ASD state plan the Region 5 Autism Summit Committee group is working on. Representatives from many different organizations have been involved in the development of the state plan, including: Autism Society of Minnesota, ARC Greater Twin Cities, Autism Advocacy and Law Center, CASCW, MNAAP, the MN Departments of Education, Health, and Human Services, SAAF, parents, self-advocates, and family members, among others. The goal of the strategic plan is to help the State of Minnesota implement new policies surrounding ASD, as the prevalence rates continue to increase. Through the development of new policies, the hope is to better accommodate the specific and unique needs

associated with this group of individuals and their families/caregivers. The group has extensively looked at ways to move forward to address challenges in a comprehensive, interdisciplinary, and culturally-responsive way. The Minnesota Autism Spectrum Disorder Task Force will be looking at ways to collaborate with the Autism Summit Committee group and the University of Minnesota to make recommendations to the Legislature on implementing a state plan.

## **Discussion/New Business**

The task force discussed various ASD related topics such as autism waivers and how they are different from other DD and CADI waivers offered by the MN Department of Human Services, the statewide implementation grant, and potential topics for the next meetings. Representatives from the departments will give an update on their respective department-wide autism related efforts at the next meeting.
