- Idea: request financial information from DHS (e.g., how much does an average background study cost them? What does an average reconsideration? Etc).
- Problem: background studies/reconsiderations not transferable. Workforce problem (delays in hiring, costs for employer, etc).
- Quantifiable cost for employers from delays in background study process.
- Idea: group should try to bring in employer's perspectives.
