Health Care Access Commission Timeline

August 15th – HCAC Meeting

- Subcommittee Co-Chair present their respective timelines to Commission Co-Chairs (Just something in writing nothing too formal)
- Commission co-chairs distribute final changes to the Working groups and distribute timeline for the commission

By September 30th

- Commission begins meeting weekly on Wednesday
- Subcommittees continue to meet at the discretion of the co-chairs
- Commission should begin to tackle the question of a mandate
- Co-Chairs begin to have biweekly meetings with staff to discuss modeling/research needed from the Departments, etc.

By October 15

- First set of models sent to the Departments for fiscal notes
- Continue to work on models
- Identifying H.C. Costs/Savings group needs to send ideas to the Restructuring H.C. through Identified Savings Group

By October 31st – November 7th

- All subcommittee recommendations should be completed or first part submitted to the Co-chairs
- Commission members begin reviewing all subcommittee reports
- Begin to hear from the Transformation Taskforce, Purchasing study and other groups
- New Cost Containment Strategies group needs to send ideas to the Restructuring H.C. through Identified Savings Group

By November 30th

- Have heard from all subcommittees on their set of recommendations
- Finish all modeling needed from the Department (they will probably need a month to do it depending on the model of course due to staff)
- Begin working on what the final proposal should look like

By December 17th

- Finish all public meetings on topics related to the full proposal
- Continue work on developing legislation

December 17th

• Staff and co-chairs sit down for a full day meeting to review what of the proposal has already been done and what still needs to be

January 3rd

• Give proposal to all commission members and subcommittee co-chairs for comments

January 7th

 Release the proposal to key public/private sector people (mostly those on the commission already) for comments

January 15th

• Release it to the public and begin working on the actual legislation

January 16th

• Have a hearing to hear from the public (possibly)
