Using an applied learning training model and cutting-edge caregiving curriculum delivered online by college faculty, HSS creates knowledgeable caregivers that are innovative and creative champions in their communities.

HSS APPRENTICES LEARNE

All HSS courses are taught online by college faculty who specialize in older adult care. In addition to class time, apprentices are required to complete 100-500 hours of on-the-job apprenticeship training for each of the seven courses.



Introduction to the Health Support Specialist (3 credits) orients new students to online learning and the history of the aging services field, including key concepts of person-directed living, leadership, communication and life skills.



Meaningful Activities (1 credit) teaches fundamental skills, information and resources for engaging residents in meaningful life activities during daily caregiving routines.



Culinary Care (1 credit) provides students with culinary information that helps them purchase, plan, prepare and deliver a nutritional and enjoyable diet for each resident.



Environmental Services (1 credit) covers fundamentals and regulatory compliance in ensuring clean and safe spaces, including housekeeping and laundering procedures.



Memory Care (1 credit) explores the aging process related to various dementia-related diagnosis, introducing methods for involving residents and family in purposeful living.



Psychosocial Care (1 credit) examines the emotional, social and spiritual dimensions of holistic care and how each can be influenced by life transitions and loss.



Physiological Care (a credit) introduces the structure and functions of the aging body, identifying strategies for managing healthy aging and common physiological alternations.

Once you've signed up as an HSS Sponsor Site, you'll receive a Transformation Coach and Site Orientation Guide. Your HSS Transformation Coach will walk you through the next steps, helping you and your team build a customized implementation plan and answering questions along the way.



COSTS?

The full tuition expense for all seven HSS courses is \$1,710 (\$190 per credit) per apprentice. Eligible organizations are able to have the entire expense reimbursed through the Minnesota DHS Nursing Facility Employee Scholarship Program.

In addition to tuition, organizations are also required to identify the pay scale for apprentices, including a starting wage, at least one intermediary step and a final "journey worker" wage for those that complete the full program. These wages are unique to each community and set by the organization leadership. The Minnesota Department of Labor and Industry's Registered Apprenticeship Unit offers complimentary on-site technical assistance to help you develop this wage matrix.



ELIGIBILITY

Before enrolling as an HSS apprentice, students must meet the following prerequisites:

- " 18 years old or older
- High school diploma or GED
- Nursing Assistant, Registered
