




Program Year: October 2014 - September 2015

Pre-Nursing Assistant Training (Pre-NAR) – begun in 2013

○ 32 students enrolled this year – 22 have advanced to Nursing Assistant Training

Nursing Assistant Training (NAR) – begun in 1990

- 151 students enrolled this year (2,513 since 1990)
- o 113 Nursing Assistant job placements at 65 long-term care facilities
 - Starting annual salary \$11.87 per hour @ 26 hours per week \approx \$16,048

College Readiness Academy (CRA) - begun in 2000

- 48 students enrolled in some or all of the courses offered this year
 - General college readiness classes
 - Mathematics tutoring
 - Human Body Systems classes
 - Grammar for College classes
 - Study skills for College classes

Medical Career Advancement (MCA) - begun in 1999

- o 26 students enrolled and were provided with tuition assistance
 - Tuition Assistance this year was provided by Minnesota Job Skills Partnership, Care Providers, and a private donation.28 students enrolled in the bridge, support, and certificate review classes for the Phlebotomy Certification Program at Saint Paul College
- o 24 students enrolled in the TEAS (Test of Essential Academic Skills) prep class
- 10 job placements this year (3 Registered Nurses, 1 Licensed Practical Nurse,
 5 Phlebotomy Technicians, 1 Medical Lab Assistant)

An instructor from the International Institute of Minnesota taught the bridge class prior to the A & P course, as well as the 1-hour support classes following each A & P class. The FastTRAC students attended all of these sessions in addition to the A & P classes taught by an instructor from Saint Paul College.

Job Retention: Nursing Assistant Training and Medical Career Advancement

- 6-month retention: 94% of those contacted were still working six months after placement; 95% of those placed were contacted.
- 12-month retention: 92% of those contacted were still working twelve months after placement; 90% of those place were contacted.
