Barriers Assessment Form for Scope of Practice Changes

Purpose and Use

This form is designed to assess the barriers and identify related strategies to accomplishing the intent of the actual or potential statutory change for scope of practice for regulated health professions/occupations. It may be used as a guide prior to drafting a bill to proactively identify potential barriers related to scope of practice or to assess progress once statutes are implemented. It can be used by groups intending to propose or evaluate scope proposals.

The form was developed for the State of Minnesota by a core team of professional health care associations, state health licensing boards, state legislators, and the Minnesota Department of Health, Office of Rural Health and Primary Care in partnership with the National Governors Association, Center for Best Practices and the National Conference of State Legislatures.
