Senate DFL Proposal on Tiered Licensure Framework – Legislative Study Group on Educator Licensure

- This Board of Teaching proposal is a good starting point, but the Senate wants to take this opportunity to further simplify the teacher licensing system.
- The Senate's proposal provides simplicity and clarity for all involved in educator licensing: teachers, teacher candidates, administrators, licensing staff and legislators.
- The OLA report provided a concept in their report, basically an example of what could be done. The OLA report also assumes that there may need to be serious policy discussions as we move forward on tiered licensure
- The Senate's proposal embraces the simplicity and transparency of the OLA concept, and incorporates some of the stakeholder input from the Board of Teaching draft:
 - The Senate proposal seeks to further streamline the various license types and exceptions—beyond what the BoT proposes in their tiered licensing model.
 - The Senate proposal gives the legislature the flexibility to modify state law to best fit the needs of a more transparent licensure program.
