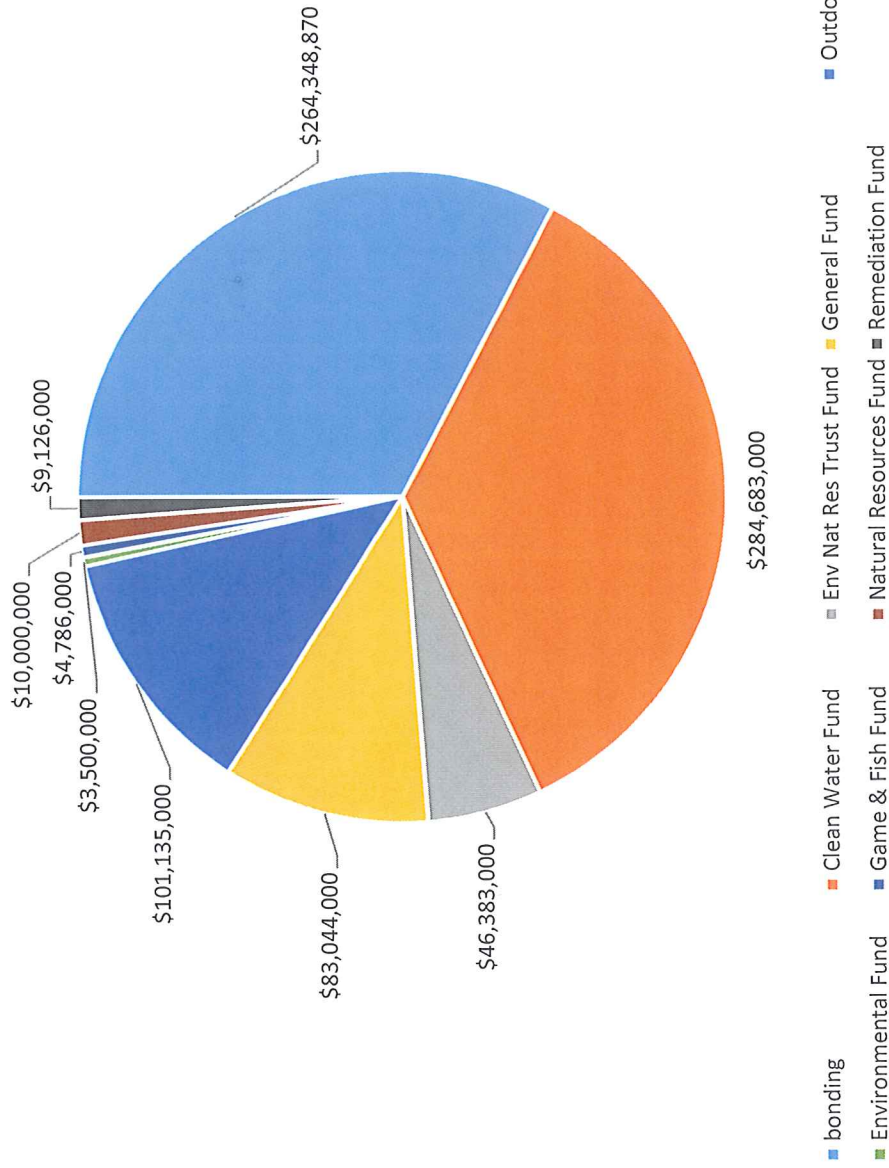

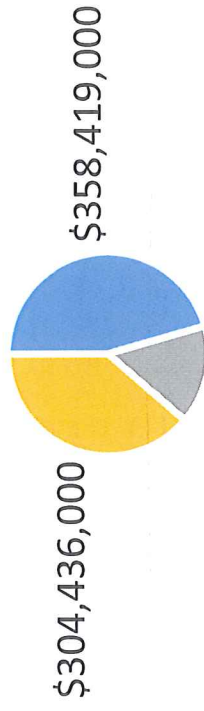

Comparison of Funding Sources for Proposed Bill Appropriations

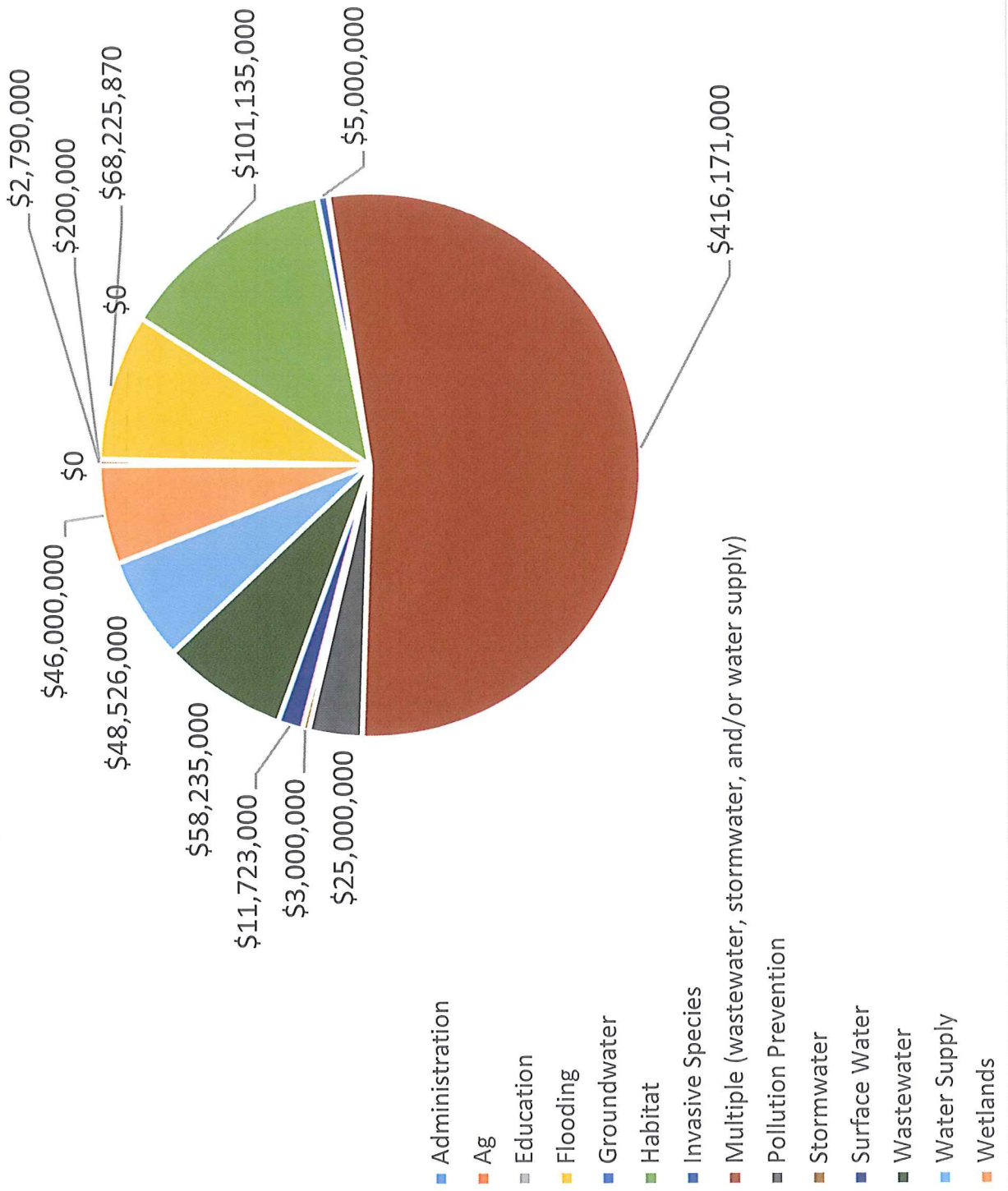


Expenditures by Category

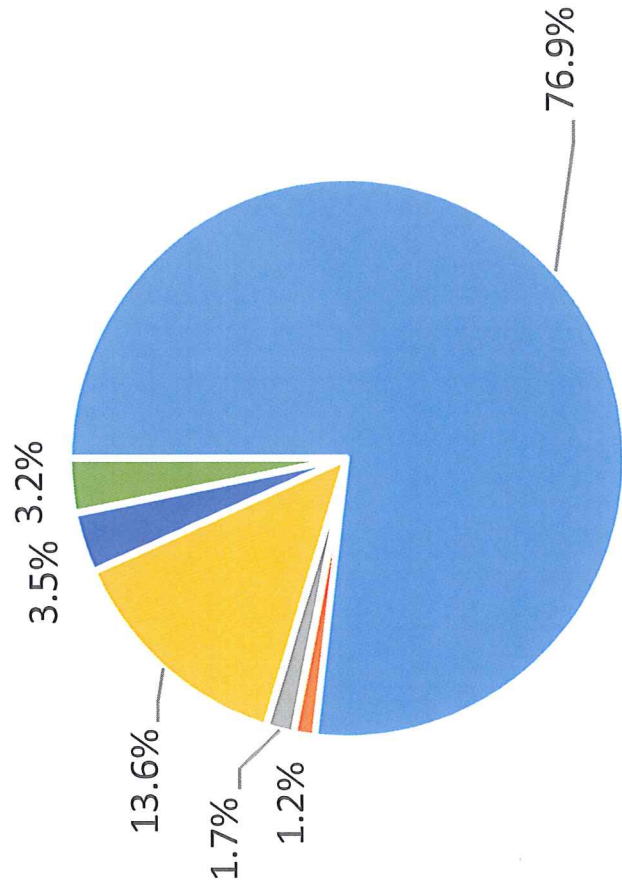
