Dear Barb and members of the Legislative Water Commission,

Freshwater priorities for solving the wastewater issues are as follows:

- 4. Identify Opportunities for regional cooperation for administration and O&M
 - We like this approach for being local, self-organized and private
 - Desired legislative action is a bill to overtly provide statutory language to allow such associations to form and for the costs to be eligible utility costs.
- 6. Continue/increase PFA loan/grant funding
 - Yes, but...a spending plan must accompany this.
 - Develop a formula where population, treatment level, median income, etc. are factored into a calculation of return on investment.
 - Set budget targets based on known depreciation of infrastructure
 - Acknowledge that certain populations may not be viable.
- 2. Pilot a watershed-scale program and involve ag in the planning
