
## **STATE OF MN WATER**

- National Drought Mitigation Center: 10/18 Drought Monitor
- DNR: September 2016 Hydrologic Conditions Report

### **STATE OF SEPTICS**

MPCA has released its <u>2015 SSTS Annual Report</u>; some key findings:

- 543,000 subsurface treatment systems (SSTS, or septic systems) were reported across MN
- most SSTSs residential systems
- about 1/3<sup>rd</sup> of SSTSs are less than 14 years old
- septic discharges represent an estimated 37.2BGY of wastewater
- 151 local governmental units in 60 counties have point-of-sale inspection triggers
- over 14,500 compliance inspections of existing septic systems (2.7%) were reported in 2015 (see how your counties are doing below)
