

Citizens can track state government's performance using new 'Accountability Minnesota' website

Site reports results on nearly 100 goals at 25 state agencies

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(ST. PAUL) – Minnesotans now have a new online resource for evaluating the performance of Minnesota state government agencies and programs.

The new Accountability Minnesota website, <u>www.accountability.state.mn.us</u>, provides performance information on 94 specific goals from 25 Executive Branch agencies and offices. Visitors to the website can learn about state government's progress toward:

- Protecting the safety of the food supply from farm to consumer
- Encouraging and promoting the development of locally owned wind energy projects
- Closing the achievement gap and preparing every Minnesotan for success after high school
- Reducing infant mortality rates
- Developing an effective and accountable mental health system
- Preparing Iron Range communities for change and growth
- Improving workplace safety and health
- Preserving vital natural areas and resources for future generations
- Recruiting and retaining National Guard members
- Restoring impaired waters to their best and highest use
- Increasing the speed, accuracy, convenience and ease of tax filing and paying
- Preserving critical bridge and pavement infrastructure

"State government must measure and report results to be effective," said Governor Tim Pawlenty. "With this website, citizens can monitor our progress on nearly 100 goals."

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Visitors to the website can locate information by theme, such as education, public safety or transportation; by state agency; and by using the search feature.

In addition to reporting results, the website includes a convenient electronic feedback form that forwards the public's comments directly to the specified agency, as well as links to additional information about agencies and programs.


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
