Representative Poston called the meeting of the Subcommittee on Minnesota Water Policy to order at 9:33 a.m. A quorum was present.

Representative Heintzeman moved to approve Subcommittee Meeting Minutes from October 20, 2021. Senatore Eaton 2nd. **Motion Prevailed.**

Dr. Melinda Erickson, USGS, provided a presentation on Arsenic in groundwater; options for well owners.

Dr. Dan Kaiser, UM, discussed Nitrogen fertilizer amendments.

Dr. Raj Mann, MDA, provided a presentation on the Registration of fertilizer, soil, and plant amendments.

Randall Doneen, DNR, addressed Public Water and Public Water Inventory

Jim Stark provided a presentation related to the Subcommittee's Legislative Agenda, Consensus was sought for:

Safe Drinking water: Allocation to MDH/UM—Voluntary private well water testing clinics (non-profit organization) (UM/MDH priority) (bill 5)

- Water Safety Plans for Cities: Appropriation for a pilot implementation (UM/MDH priority) (bill 7)
- Reactivation of the LWC and the Water Advisory Council (bill 9)
- Environmental Justice: Ensure that all have drinking water free from lead (allocation) (bill 11)

Representative Fischer made a motion t move these actions forward. Senator Eaton 2nd. Motion Prevailed.

- Safety for domestic wells--Identify vulnerable aquifers, coordinate and supplement existing agency monitoring into a coordinated network (allocation) (bill 6)
- Define sustainable groundwater limits using technological advances--define limits in a pilot onewatershed/one plan (allocation) (UM sustainability report) (bill 1)
- Soil-health action plan: Research, implementation, and outreach (allocation) (bill 8)
- Complete land preservation objectives to preserve high-valued lakes in the Upper Miss. (allocation) (bill 10)

Representative Fischer made a motion to move these actions forward. Senator Wiger 2nd. Motion **Prevailed.**

- Improve Ag production and water quality: UM allocation for research/outreach for precision agriculture (bill 3)
- Tax credit for private riparian buffer lands (bill 4)
- Policy and an appropriation to encourage groundwater recharge where needed (bill 12)
- Keeping water on the land, water retention (allocation) (bill 13)
- Watershed Districts- changing the general fund appropriation limit to support fixed costs (bill 15)

Senator Eaton made a motion to move these actions forward. Representative Fischer 2nd. Motion Previaled.

Having no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 10:34 a.m.
