Facility Investigations are conducted when allegations of maltreatment involve child foster care,

including foster families licensed by Tribes, either currently or in the past (when an allegation

involved a foster child), or in the process of being licensed, if children are in placement, family child

care, or legally unlicensed child care. This also includes reports involving children served by an

unlicensed personal care provider organization under Minnesota Statutes 256B.0659.

 Other types of facilities are investigated by other entities, including the Minnesota Departments of Education, Health, and Human Services. Facilities are held to a higher standard, as they are responsible for the care of children

that are not their own.
