- May 2024: Began working with DCYF and Ramsey County
- Six planners worked with all areas of CFS and the County Attorney's Office
- Legislative walk-through of our case continuum



## Implementation

- Subject matter experts developed detailed work plans
- Identified strategies, tasks, and resources, including updates to infrastructure
- Built continuous quality improvement into our plans

- Preventing removal
- Supporting reunification



## Data snapshot: January 1 – July 31, 2025

	Number	Percentage	
Total eligible cases	2,092	100%	
Eligible cases assigned	687	33.9%	
Assigned cases opened to ongoing case management	47	6.8%	
Assigned cases experiencing out-of-home placement	19 children; 37 cases	2.8%	




## Challenges and barriers
