




PRIORITY RANKING OF TASK FORCE RECOMMENDATIONS

- Prioritize all 93 recommendations within the framework of MACSSA Mission and Vision for the Child Protection system.
- Ranking was based upon whether the recommendation would assist in achieving the mission and vision of MACSSA for the Child Protection system.
- > The 93 recommendations were organized into seven categories.
 - Screening
 - Family Assessment
 - Racial Equity and Disparity Reduction,
 - Training
 - Adequacy of Resources
 - Oversight of County Performance,
 - Transparency.
