- 1. The overall goal of the Governor's Task Force on the Protection of Children was to change casework practices to make children safer.
- 2. We want to highlight successes resulting from the Governor's Task Force.
- 3. Some Task Force recommendations were either not accepted or aren't on the timeline yet. As members of the Governor's Task Force we would like these to be discussed and to be included in that conversation.
- 4. We recommend funding the existing system in line with caseload growth, as well as investments in prevention/early intervention to reduce the need for child protection.
